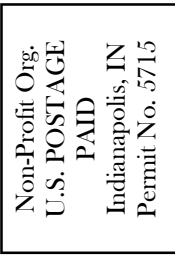

Dr. Jack T. Sanders

These lectures analyze the ways the author of Acts portrays Jews, paying attention to differences between how Jews appear in the narrative and how speakers in Acts—especially Peter and Paul—refer to Jews in their sermons.

Jack T. Sanders received his Ph.D. from the Claremont Graduate University in Southern California. He taught at three Protestant seminaries prior to the University of Oregon, from which he retired in 2002. He is the author of *The Jews in Luke-Acts* and *Schismatics, Sectarians, Dissidents, Deviants: The First One Hundred Years of Jewish-Christian Relations* and is at work on a biography, *Samuel Rothchild: Jewish Pioneer in the Days of the Old West*.

Clark M. Williamson is Indiana Professor of Christian Thought, Emeritus, at CTS. He holds a Ph.D. from the University of Chicago Divinity School. A systematic theologian, he concentrates on rethinking Christian theology after the Holocaust. His most recent book, co-authored with Ronald Allen, is *Preaching the Old Testament* (Westminster/John Knox Press, 2007).
